10 am

I'd start by taking my friends to the Cité du Train. I love this place, it's a trip back in time!

12 pm

Back to the centre! We'd get off the tram, go past Tour de l'Europe and Schweissdissi then onto Rue du Sauvage. It's Tilvist for lunch, a real home from home! It serves simple vegetarian dishes but you can also stop for a coffee or tea (organic) and pick up crockery or local products.



Fine arts museum, Mulhouse

1.30 pm

We'd start with the place de la Réunion and the History Museum to explore the centre: a perfect place to learn about where we are and Mulhouse's history.

I love art and painting (and my friends do too) so I'd go to the Fine Arts Museum with a look at the lovely Steinbach Park on the way. It's just been made over and looks great!

We'd go past the stunning Saint-Jean Chapel to end the afternoon on a high.

If there's still time then it's worth a trip to the Museum of Printed Textiles. There's always a great exhibition on as well as their permanent collection about the history of textile printing, specifically in Mulhouse.

7 pm

I'd take you for dinner at Food Link on Rue de l'Arsenal. Good times guaranteed at this organic vegan eatery with its great atmosphere and fresh produce.

9 pm

After dinner, it's time for a drink at Le Gambrinus, a local institution!

9 am

Before hopping on my bike, I get everything I need for a break ready and stop at my local bakery in the Fonderie neighbourhood to pick up snacks!

9.30 am

I hit the road along the Ill behind the Illberg pool near the Maison des Berges and Pont Chinois. I ride to Didenheim and stop on one of the little beaches by the Ill for a well-deserved coffee and croissant break.

I go through Didenheim and turn left at the church then onto Rue de Zillisheim until the little car park. I drop my bike off and walk on a footpath through the field to a lovely pebble beach by the Ill surrounded by nature.

12 pm

I spread my picnic out here. It's a great place for kids to play! You may even find a swing made up on a branch.

2 pm

To get back I go on Rue de Zillisheim behind the greenhouses which turns into a dirt track taking you into Zillisheim itself.

Then I hook up with the Rhône-Rhine Canal on the way to Brunstatt village. I stop at the Croix du Burn site. This lovely park is home to Saint-Georges Chapel and the famous Sainte-Odile spring. You can't drink the water but it was said to have magical powers. When I got my first glasses, my grandma would use it to wash my eyes because she thought it would ease my short-sightedness!

A little further away in the village centre, stop for a coffee on the Le Cheval Blanc terrace. The sweet treats at Gaugler are worth the detour too! Depending on the schedule, make the most of it to visit one of the exhibitions at La Cour des Arts.

4.30 pm

It's time to ride home along the canal. This is the Eurovélo 6 route, one of the top European bike paths. It's a great bike ride for the family: the roads are almost all flat!

When I'm home, I put my things down, unwind and get ready for dinner.

7 pm

Isn't the saying no pain, no gain? I'll give you a treat to end the day on a high (we'll drive because it's a steep ride!) at a restaurant in the Reberg area: L'Estérel. It deserves a Michelin star, believe me!

9/10 pm

If you still have the energy for a drink, end the day at NoMad in my neighbourhood or Hardivin wine bar in Mulhouse centre.

2 DAYS WITH...

1st day

MORNING. Let's go to Waldeck forest in mulhouse! This is where my parents go running, Axel dances hip hop and Amandine enjoys the great outdoors...

Mulhouse zoological and botanical Garden is right next to the forest. There are lots of cute animals here and you can often see baby ones. You learn all about animals, how to protect them and our planet. I almost forgot: there are flowers all year in the grounds and there's a large play area.

20,000 m² of exhibitions, 15,000 m² of outdoor displays and fun-filled educational activities await. Explore the museum on a little electric train, go back in time on the Sambaldu-sur-Mou 40s carousel...

STREET ART IN MULHOUSE: ORLINDA LAVERGNE



It often pops up on a street corner, it can go unnoticed or make an impact... Street art is all over Mulhouse. The city actually has a legacy of murals and wall paintings. From a cheeky trompe-l'œil to a fresh spin on urban fixtures, there are surprises galore! Interview with Orlinda Lavergne, a key street art figure in Mulhouse.

01 *Orlinda, you're an integral part of life in Mulhouse! Can you tell us about your gallery and specifically your involvement in street art?*

We moved to Mulhouse in October 2015. We aim to promote street/urban artists through our gallery. We host solo and group exhibitions where we invite several artists to explore a theme of our choice. We are also involved in promotion in the street, outside the gallery, through the partnerships we've established with institutions like Mulhouse Council, private partners and companies. We work in these 2 areas. We need to get outside the

gallery. It's the very DNA of urban art, it's for everyone. The movement has so much to give.

02 *Do you have a favourite among the murals you've created in partnership?*

Yes, I'd say the one by Dourone for several reasons: it's majestic, it's a female figure and now more than ever, we need to support the movement to emancipate and promote womanhood. In terms of symbolism, it's vital to present this aspect. It was also my first major project in Mulhouse and we really loved working with the locals.

We ran children's workshops, hosted get-togethers for teenagers and the artist to show them that anything is possible, that they can make their dreams a reality.

03 *Do you have a favourite local artist?*

It's hard to choose because different types of art speak to me. There's Bruno Lévalle who works in India ink and draws mainly women; Niak who's part of the Schlager collective, as is Ferni... OK, the whole collective! I'm closer to that movement but there are lots of contemporary or graphic artists in Mulhouse. Anne-Marie Ambiehl is one of them.

04 *Do you have any favourite places in Mulhouse itself? Places where you like to eat or walk?*

I have to mention my street, Rue des 3 Rois. I'm not from Mulhouse but since I moved here the street has started buzzing. When I need a break at lunchtime I go to Plume or Stroganoff, a Russian restaurant serving

beef stroganoff, borscht and Russian dumplings. If you fancy something exotic then I recommend Les Saveurs du Liban. You can find real gems at Huggy, a 60s/70s bric-a-brac shop! I like Steinbach Park, the Fine Arts Museum and place de la Paix too. I really like squares because that's where people get together.



05 *Anything you'd like to add?*

I want to believe in the city. It has the potential to be one of France's greatest cities that can blossom like a flower on its European crossroads. It can do it, I mean, we can all do it. We're here to make Mulhouse an appealing city, innovative with Motoco, KMO that's just opened, the Almaleggo design building.

This is an experimental city that wants to push boundaries. There's no limits, we're lucky to have real freedom to experiment.

MOTOCO, THE ULTIMATE DESIGN CENTRE



Martine Zussy,
Motoco DIRECTOR

Tell us about the Motoco concept?

It's a unique place in one of the DMC factory's buildings in Mulhouse. 140 artists work in a striking 6,000 m² industrial setting: it's the biggest artist's residence in France. We host all sorts of private, public, artistic and cultural events on the 2,000 m² ground floor devoted to functions: theatre, electro nights, new car launches and more. There are a hundred events scheduled for 2019.

Motoco is an artist's residence but it's primarily a workplace which isn't open to the general public (but they can visit the DMC brownfield). When can the general public visit Motoco?

We host workshops four times a year: mid-May, mid-September, over the Christmas market period and, from next year, mid-March. Tours are on Saturday at 2pm with a Saturday night event until 6pm on Sunday.

Do you have a go-to in the Mulhouse area, outside Motoco of course?

Like many locals, Nomad is my HQ. I also love Mulhouse market and climbing up to the Belvedere. The dock sides are also somewhere I've only recently unearthed. I love the great outdoors in the city centre! Where I live I can cross the bridge and soak up nature in the city with ducks and birds. There's something wild about it. I love that.



Anne-Sophie Tschiegg

What brought you to Motoco?

I've been an artist for 35 years. I lived in Strasbourg and found out about Motoco. I didn't have a choice, I just had to come here! For the setting, the feel... I was one of the last to come here, I've had the keys for a year now and I've had a hectic six months after time settling into the site.



Collectif 2920g

Six people from different backgrounds and places met at HEAR art school and founded their collective that is now based in Motoco. They mainly work in stage design, graphic design, furniture and objects.

The collective likes to work with other Motoco artists. They're working with Vortex X (collective famous for their canvases made from recycled sanitary towels) on the building's future logo.

HEAR graduates Maxime from Mulhouse, Louis from Saint-Etienne and Pauline from Clermont Ferrand talk to us.



Do you have any favourite places in Mulhouse?

I really love my journey from home in Brunstatt to Motoco. I love brick whether it be the Brunstatt townhouses, industrial buildings like Motoco, the Manufacture or the church behind the DMC brownfield near the L'Alsace newspaper HQ. I love the parks too: they take me back to my childhood e.g. Place de la Bourse and its arcades. I really like Mulhouse's landscaping!

What brought you to Motoco?

We were already doing stage design for Bass'Couture (collective hosting electro nights). We had the chance to have a studio here. We seized it so we could be in a unique working environment forming bonds with the other residents.

Do you have any favourite places in Mulhouse?

Pauline: Le Greffier bar, it's long been the Fine Arts HQ. Plus the owner "lent" us the site pretty fast to revamp it. It's a home from home!

Maxime: The terrace at the Shamrock.

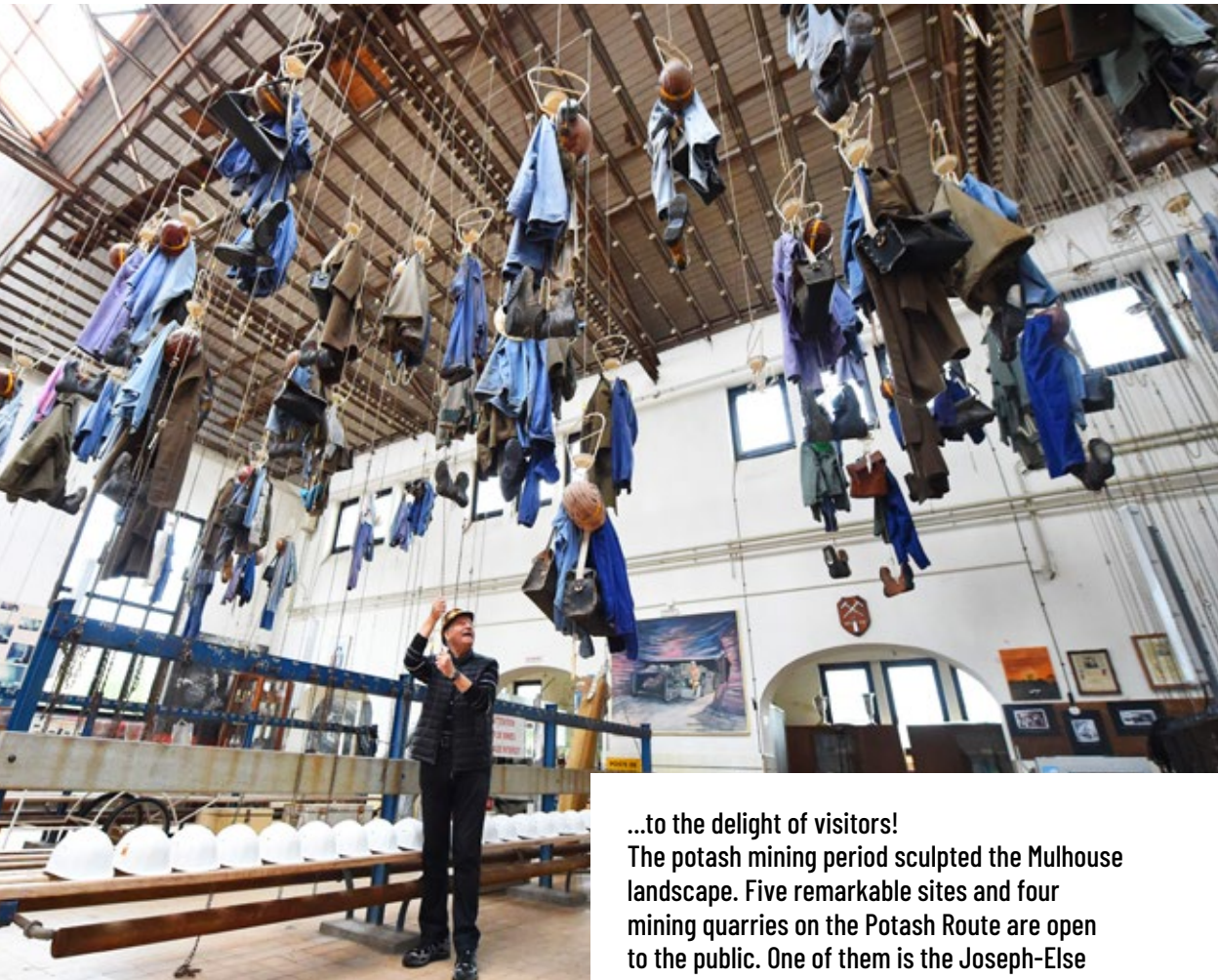
Louis: And Pétanques Electro that come back every summer!

POTASH ROUTE PAULI RELIVES HIS MINING PAST...



...to the delight of visitors!

The potash mining period sculpted the Mulhouse landscape. Five remarkable sites and four mining quarries on the Potash Route are open to the public. One of them is the Joseph-Else quarry and its mining museum with guided tours run by passionate former miners such as Pauli...



The Kalivie Association has been protecting the Alsace Potash Mining heritage since 1998. Since the last mines closed in 2002, their role has taken on a new meaning. They want to share, introduce and explain this material and immaterial heritage to the masses: history and expertise gained over a century of mining that should be told to young and future generations.

Share, introduce and explain this material and immaterial heritage to the masses

LET'S HAND OVER TO THE MINER!

Pauli is one of the association's ambassadors. He's a real character if you've been lucky enough to meet him and hear what he has to say. The history of the potash mines comes to life when he speaks. It's straight from the horse's mouth as Pauli has gone down to the mine countless times to work his socks off. Like the other guides in the association, Pauli was a miner. He's one of thousands of miners who went underground to extract potash mineral. An experience that made its mark on men, their personality, education and entire life...

STORYTELLERS

Pauli and the association's miners tend to talk to young students about the history of the mines and workers at permanent and temporary exhibitions.

Pauli shares the importance of loving your work as "if you love your job, you do it far better!". Despite being over 80, his emotion and energy take us back to the everyday lives of these hardened workers.

The items, models, machines and fixtures from different mining sites come to life with Pauli's moving words in the old cloakroom at the Joseph-Else mine, now a historical site exploring potash.

40 YEARS UNDERGROUND

After the museum tour and film describing the mine and miners' work comes the highlight of the show: the "hanging room", an identical reconstruction of the mine's cloakroom and the infirmary. This is where Pauli holds onto the hook that was his for 40 years and drops the chain to bring down his hanger and work clothes.

The former miners' commitment and motivation to share their past are rewarded by visitors' awe who pour out praise in their emails and the guestbook. Their words are full of emotion and recognition after a tour oozing these men's endless passion for their bygone trade.

Place de la Réunion

The place to be in Mulhouse! The former Town Hall and its colourful houses make you feel like you're in a fairytale. It also sets the scene for major events such as the Christmas Market. Whether adorned with cloth and illuminations or basking in the summer sunshine, it's a sight for sore eyes. It's the best terrace in the city too making it the perfect place for a break.

The Commandery in Rixheim and its grounds

The Commandery was founded by the Teutonic Order in the 18th century and is now home to Rixheim Town Hall, the Wallpaper Museum and the fascinating Zuber wallpaper factory that still prints wallpaper by hand using wooden blocks. Fabulous grounds lie behind the museum and are open to the general public on Sundays and bank holidays in summer.





Belvédère

This steel tower in the heart of the Reberg neighbourhood, the city's green lung, was built in the 19th century. It's all worth it when you get to the top: magical views of Mulhouse and its surroundings. It's also a fabulously romantic place for a drink or intimate picnic...

Cour des Chaînes

This cobbled courtyard is in a cobbled pedestrian street in the old town on Rue des Franciscains. It oozes magic with its paintings depicting major Mulhouse figures through history. Who are its neighbours? Il Cortile, a Michelin-starred restaurant, a new "urban open-air bar", a former factory that looks like a small castle and some trendy bars and restaurants.

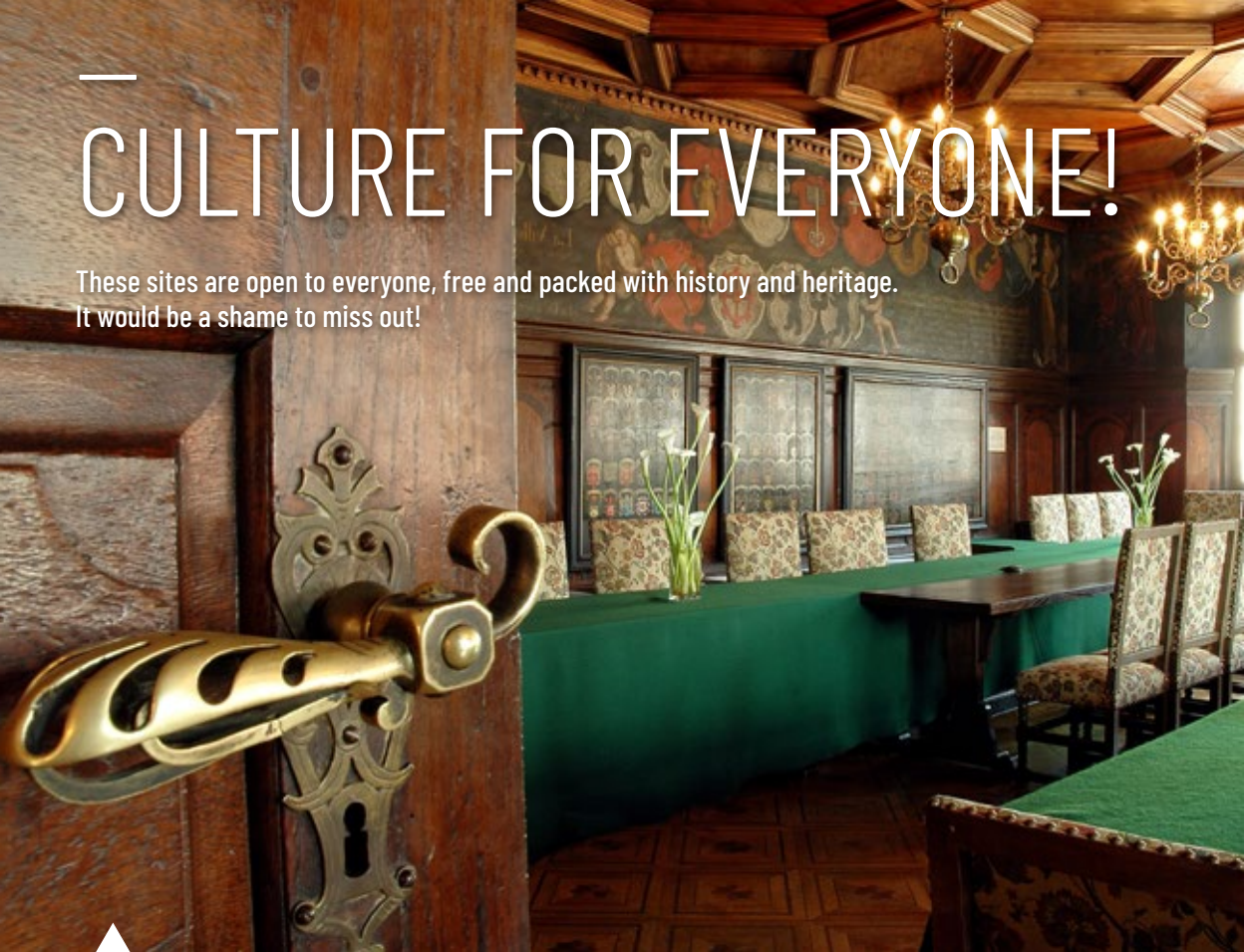


Reberg manor houses

Reberg, a former hilltop vineyard, set the scene for manor houses owned by Mulhouse business owners. These villas encapsulate the wealth at the time: owners commissioned architects to outdo each other with a variety of styles such as oriental, seaside, Alsatian and more. The stunning grounds are bursting with species their owners brought back from far-flung voyages. Take a walk around the area to get up close and personal with them!

Historical Museum

The museum in the former Town Hall towering over place de la Réunion takes you back to Paleolithic times up to the present day. The collections are rich and diverse: furniture, costumes, tools, toys and the famous Klapperstein to name but a few.

The Klapperstein is a grimacing stone mask weighing a dozen kilos. The 13th century tradition saw gossiping women punished to wear the Klapperstein around their necks and walk from one side of the city to the other as the crowd booed at them.

It was built between 1020 and 1040 by Rudolf von Altenburg, one of the founders of the House of Habsburg, and consecrated by the Alsatian Pope Leon IX in 1049. Its octagonal layout, copied from the Aix-la-Chapelle Palatine Chapel, makes it a unique building in Alsace's religious architecture.

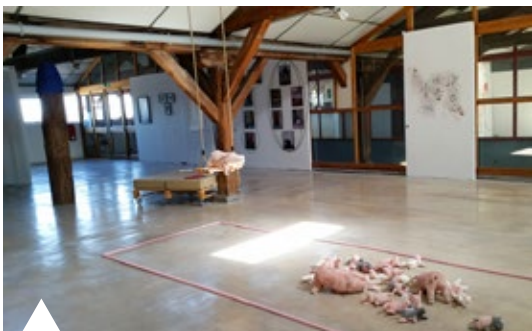

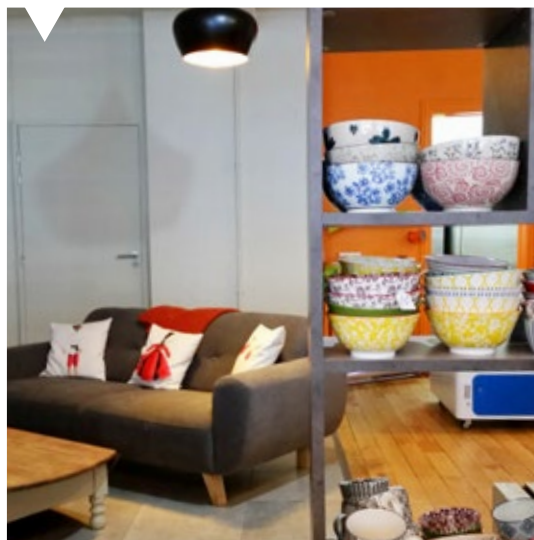
